1. HDSC will be the first “One Stop Shop” on Oahu helping Hawaii's people in need; Youth, Families, Men, Women, and anyone needing HELP!

2. Fostering all Community Resources and Focus Through A Diverse Community Transformation.
3. Providing Inspiration and Major IMPACT Shelter, Food, Clothing, Job and Vocational Training, Life Skills, Mentoring to the Next Generation and Much More.
4. HDSC's goal is to get to the root of the homeless problem and offers life changing solutions.
5. HDSC is a “Civil Defense Site” to house over 10,000 people in case a “Katrina” type storm hits Oahu.
6. HDSC is a 24/7 “Recycling Center” for State, City & County, Federal, and Individuals.

What will HDSC look like and how much will it cost?

Land - \$10 Million

- 204 acres in Kunia
 - 2 acres for farmers homes (20 homes - \$170,000 x 20 = 3.4 million)
 - 75 acres for the Dream Center
 - 75 acres for farming
 - 52 acres for affordable homes (520 affordable homes in perpetuity)

Campus - \$190 million

- Twelve Buildings built in this order:
 - Family Building
 - Women's Building
 - Culinary Arts Building
 - Men's Building
 - Youth Building
 - Recreation Building
 - Warehouse 1
 - EXPO Center/Auditorium
 - Warehouse 2 and 3
 - Training Hotel
 - Ramia Center
